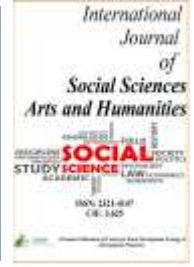

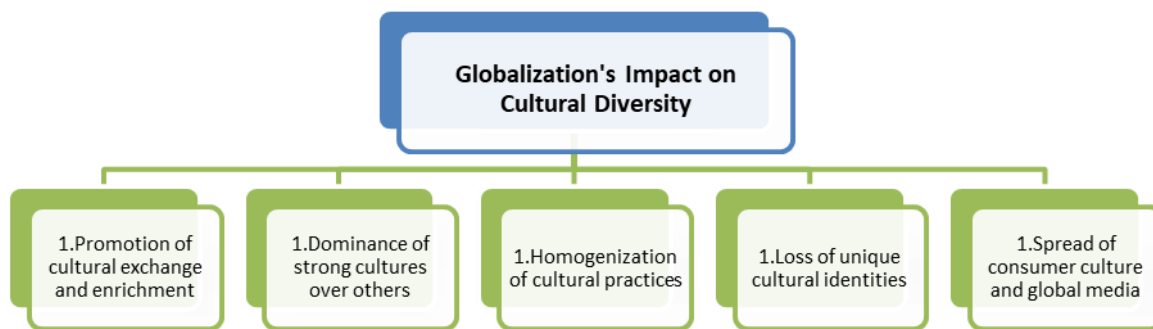


Fig 2: The impacts of globalization on cultural diversity. (Source: Self developed)

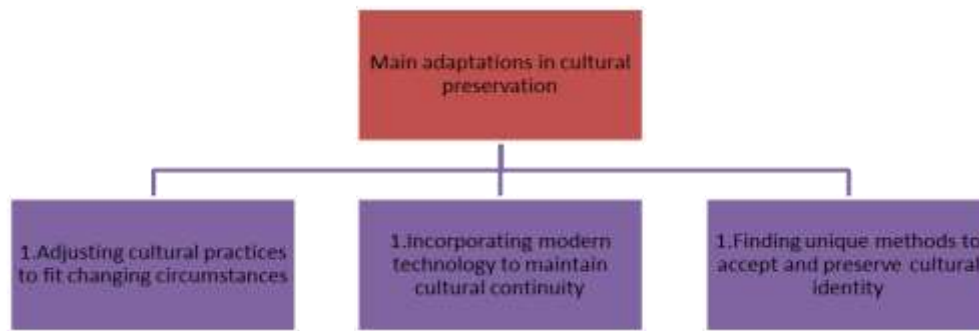


Fig 3: Main adaptations in the process of cultural preservation. (Source: Self developed)
